THE UNIT/ORGANIZATION AGREES THAT:

1. RESERVATIONS

- a. Accepted on a first come, first serve basis
- b. All reservations must be in writing
- c. All reservations must be pre-paid

2. CANCELLATIONS

- a. Fees are non-refundable
- b. No shows forfeit all fees paid
- c. Cancellations forfeit 50% of fees paid
- d. No penalty for rescheduling if done at least 30 days in advance of scheduled date of use. Under 30 days notice requires a 25% service charge.

3. LEADERSHIP

At least 2 adults must accompany all youth groups and be in attendance at all times during their stay. One adult must be at least 21 years of age; the second must be at least 18 years of age. For Scout groups at least one adult must be registered with the BSA and the other may be a parent.

4. HEALTH AND ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The Mid-America Council has purchased the National BSA Council Accident & Sickness Plan, which covers Mid-America Council Pack, Troop, and/or Crew members for both accident and illnesses; which manifest themselves during participation in Boy Scout activities. All other groups/individuals reserving camp will not be covered by this plan.

5. LIABILITY INSURANCE

Non BSA groups must provide a certificate of liability insurance with policy limits of at least one million dollars, naming the Mid-America Council and the BSA as a co-insured. Non-Scout groups must also sign a hold harmless agreement.

6. RESTRICTED ACTIVITIES

No alcohol, illegal drugs, firearms, fire works or pets are allowed on Scout Camp property. Snowmobiles, motor cycles or horseback riding are not permitted. Individuals or groups in violation may be asked to leave camp without refund of fee. A camping area is designated by a latrine and a fire ring. Camping is permitted only in camping areas. Fires of any kind are permitted only inside a fire ring.

7. MOTORIZED VEHICLES

All motorized vehicles must remain on designated camp roads, parking only in designated areas and are subject to other restrictions due to season and activity.

*Personal ATVs are not permitted on camp property.

8. DAMAGES AND CLEANUP

The unit or organization is responsible for all clean up and damages. Repairs and necessary cleaning will be charged to the unit. Report all needed repairs to ranger immediately.

9. BUILDING USAGE

Camping/sleeping in buildings not intended for that purpose is not permitted.

10. CHECKIN/CHECKOUT

All units must check-in/ check-out with Camp Ranger or Campmaster.

11. TOUR PERMIT

Units utilizing Mid-America Council Camps do not need to file a Tour Permit with the Council. The Tour Planning Worksheet Should be used to ensure proper supervision and planning.

12. CANOE RENTAL

Safety Afloat and Safe Swim Defense Plans must be used and Certified Aquatics Personnel must be in attendance.

LOCATION OF CAMPS

CAMP EAGLE/CAMP CEDARS – Camp Cedars and Eagle are located approximately 3 miles north of Hwy 109, just east of Cedar Bluffs, NE on the south bank of the Platte River.

LITTLE SIOUX SCOUT RANCH – from I-29 take Little Sioux Exit (exit 95). Travel east through town on IA Hwy 301. Turn left on blacktop road heading toward Pisgah (Co Rd F-20). Watch for sign to camp. At fork in the road, go left on gravel road (Co Rd L-14 Larpenteur) follow about 3 miles to Scout Ranch, which is on the right. Traveling from the north on I-29 take Blencoe IA Exit, travel east thru town on Hwy E 60. Cross the Little Sioux River, take a right on CO Rd L-14 follow 2 miles to Scout Ranch.

CAMP WAKONDA – Take US 75 to Cornhusker Rd Exit. Go east as the street name changes to Harvell Rd keep going past Ft. Crook Rd and Galvin Rd. Turn left on Lincoln Rd go north until Bellevue Blvd S is on the right and Lorraine is on the left. Camp Wakonda sign shows to take a right. Continue on Bellevue Blvd S. until Forest Dr. Camp Wakonda sign shows to take a left. Follow Forest Dr. until the end of the road.

CAMP ASHFORD – Take US Hwy 77 to Homer NE, in mid-town see a sign for Camp Ashford head east and follow signs.
